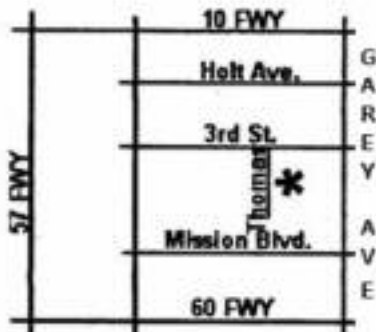

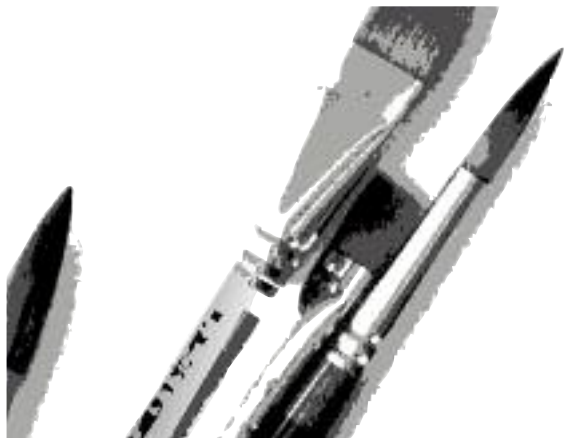

Make Your Sketches a Valuable Part of Your Preliminary Work.

For many artists, the sketches or drawings they create are a finished piece of art. These are often accomplished artists

that may work primarily in charcoal, pen & ink, colored pencils or another media that they have become comfortable using. The drawings they have completed will often be framed and matted very much like those artists that squeeze their medium out of a tube. renowned sculptors and painters like Rembrandt, Da Vinci and many others have prepared drawings as a preliminary study for their artwork.

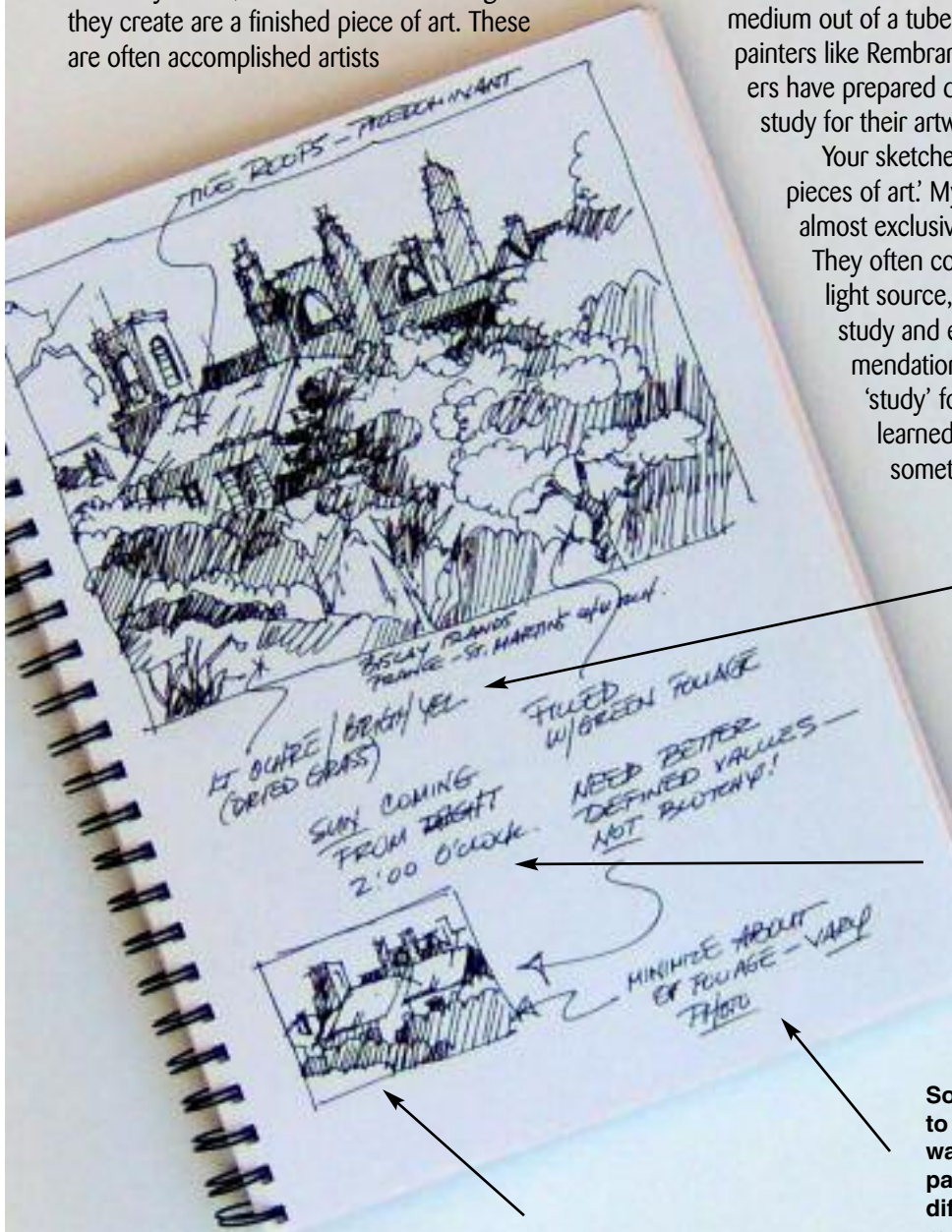
Your sketches don't need to be 'finished pieces of art.' My sketches are prepared almost exclusively as preliminary studies. They often contain notes pertaining to light source, composition variation, value study and even paint or color recommendations. I may not complete a 'study' for every painting, but have learned that my finished work will sometimes suffer as a result.

In some cases there may exist some local color that tells you to consider a specific hue. Don't rely on your memory for this record.

Make a notation about the lighting. This could simply be a reference to the time of day or sun location. Your highlights and subsequent shadows will become easier to determine.

Sometimes you will need to note a difference you want to make in the painting that is either different from what you remember seeing or what you may have photographed.

A quick value or drawing can be a great benefit. As few as 3 or 4 values (black, white and 1-2 greys) will often provide enough information to complete a successful painting.

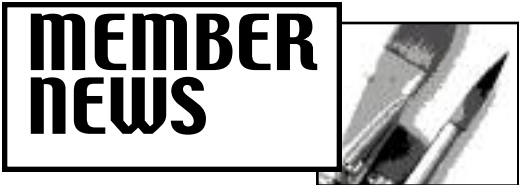

Annual OJS Celebrates Exemplary Artists at Closing Reception

The Prog Space on May 23 was the site of celebration and appreciation as those present applauded recipients of 64 awards. A broad range of artistic expression characterized the entries entered by 70 from the Inland Empire and other Southern California cities. Artists with watercolor once again representing the largest number submitted in a category with a total of 48 entries. Awards were given in the seven categories with some cash awards. Merchandise awards presented to all non-cash winners including those who received honorable mentions. The show was juried by Al Setton, noted Southern California acrylic painter and expertly curated by Hanna Adler.

Richard Freund of Redlands won Best of Show for his assemblage "Sweet Note." It's the second time he's achieved this honor. Memorial award winners were: The Milford Zornes Award, MaryAnn Osko; The Betty Hook Award, Patty McMillan; and The Bess Reide Award, Setsuko Okubo. Wade Stanley received the Associated Artist Award.

Over fifty volunteers assisted with planning, take-in, jurying, curating, hanging the show, providing refreshments for two receptions and sitting the gallery. Kudos to all those who helped to make the 29th Annual a huge success.
